Here is some helpful information so you can make an informed decision:

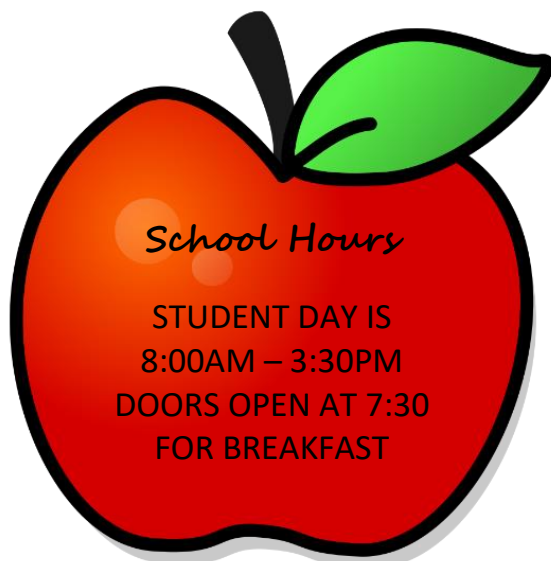
- During these 8 weeks, the key to making the most use of the program is ATTENDANCE. Your child must be present every week.

Conversations About School

When you think of parent involvement, do you picture moms and dads volunteering in classrooms? That's one way to help – but research shows that supporting your child's education at home is even more important. Here are conversation starters that will help you stay involved.

"Let's see what you worked on today."

Look at the completed work to find out what your youngster is learning how well he or she is doing. You could comment on the math work or social studies project, for instance. Also, respond to notes or messages from teachers.

"Show me what you have for homework."

It's your child's job to do homework, but you play a role, too. Make sure your child knows what they are supposed to do by having them explain the assignments to you. After it is finished, glance over the homework to see that it's complete.

"Describe a book you enjoyed today."

This gives you an idea of what your child prefers to read. Then, build a daily reading habit by asking what they'd like to read tonight. Encourage their reading skills by reading aloud or letting your child read to you.

Help Your Child Build a Strong Vocabulary

In order for your child to be successful on state exams and college entrance exams, he/she needs a strong vocabulary. Your child may already be learning a list of specific vocabulary words in school. Here's how to support that learning at home:

• **Use Flash Cards.** Being quizzed on words and their definitions might be your child's favorite activity, but it is effective – and a simple way for you to get involved. Just read the definition and have your child provide the word. Or, read the word and ask your child to name two synonyms.

• **Declare a Word of the Day.** Look at your child's vocabulary lists and choose a new word each day. Challenge family members to use this word in regular conversation.

• **Text your child** a vocabulary word and its definition. Or just text him/her a word and ask him/her to text you the definition. Kids can't seem to stay away from their phones, so texting is a great way to sneak in some learning.
